
International Education

EduCanada Tour to Japan

International services have made two recruiting trips so far this year: Frankfurt and Japan. Currently we have 73 (39.74 FTE) international students attending Lethbridge School Division, from 16 different countries. This does not include the 67 students from the Patumwan Demonstration School in Bangkok, Thailand. They arrive right after the Easter break for a four week stay and will be attending four of our high schools: Chinook, LCI, WCHS and ICS. The Thailand Spring Program is in its third year (67 students arrive on April 17, 2020).

Our Division Student Advisory Council has met several times already this year. We first met in September to get ready for the Leadership Conference: Look Outside Ourselves-Act Inside Our Circle of Influence. The conference was held at the University of Lethbridge on November 13th.
