  - b. Poverty Intervention December 13 Jamie Walburger/Lindsey O'Brien

The last Poverty Intervention Committee (PIC) was held December 13, 2022. Some of the main highlights are as follows:

• Panago Pizza North graciously donated \$800 to the committee.

•CUPE 2843 also donated \$4000 to the committee, this donation alone will be enough to provide winter clothing to nearly an entire classroom of kids in the division!

•The committee broke off into smaller groups to discuss a variety of questions such as what the role of PIC is, what do we understand the intention of PIC and how are we accomplishing it etc.

•A common theme arose that many parents and staff in the division are not aware this committee exists and are not aware of the great work it does for the division. This created the follow up question for the next meeting: "In what way would info about PIC be most effectively shared with your community?"

•Last September, Lethbridge participated in a study to measure homelessness with 65 other communities; in Lethbridge, around 400 people are affected by

homelessness, the shelter capacity is only 100, property tax is set to increase which will likely affect these numbers.

•Around 3 out of 20 students in a classroom are experiencing income-related poverty.

•3 schools have accessed PIC funds so far, this year.

•WAM (Weekend and More) are emergency food hamper bags that were developed 3 years ago and are available throughout the division for families in need.

AHS: discussed a 1-hour workshop available to kindergarten and grade 1 teachers called Food Explorers. It encourages food exploration and includes simple recipes children can prepare with their families to encourage trying new foods.
Committee discussed ways to make hygiene products readily available in elementary schools (period pouches, donations of products to schools)

  - Division is working with AHS to track the big spikes in absenteeism and reporting clusters of gastrointestinal or respiratory illnesses.
