



Summer School Welding

Would you like the opportunity to weld? Or are you interested in a career in welding? Do you have a background in welding and want to further your knowledge and understanding?

Lethbridge School Division is excited to offer metal fabrication and welding this summer. **This program is open to anyone currently in grades 10-12**. In this course you will learn how to use multiple welding processes, as well as metal cutting and metal forming equipment. What you learn in this course may be what you need to transition into a welding career after high school.

The course will run from July 17th to 28th. Monday to Thursday 8 a.m.-3 p.m. and Fridays from 8 a.m.- 12 p.m. for a total of 64 instructional hours. Throughout the two weeks you will accumulate 5 total credits towards your high school diploma. The total cost per student will be \$150 in total.

Modules covered:

- FAB 1010- Fabrication Tools & Materials
- FAB 1090- Sheet Fabrication 1
- FAB 1050- Basic Electric Welding
- FAB 1048- Semi Automated/Automated Welding
- FAB 1040- Oxyfuel Welding and Cutting

In order to be successful in completing this course, you **MUST attend class every day**. Students must show up on time and be prepared to spend the day at the school. Failure to attend each class will result in removal from the program with no refund issued. Please note: <u>school busses will not be running in the summer</u>; students are expected to have a ride to and from school every day.

What students will gain from the completion of this course?

- Shop and equipment safety
- Basic machine maintenance
- An understanding of multiple welding and forming processes (GMAW, SMAW, Oxyfuel Welding)
- Instruction from Red Seal journeypersons and industry professionals

How to apply:

Call Victoria Park High School (403-327-3945) to schedule an intake appointment with Tysen Pushor. The course capacity will be limited to 12 and initial intakes will be scheduled in the order that calls are received. Should there be greater interest than 12 students, a wait list will be created and filled only when students decline the initial acceptance. At the start of the intake meeting, students are to provide the teacher with a self-directed paragraph explaining why they would like to take the course and how they believe they will be successful.
