

Alberta Education Budget Overview Provincial Budget was released on February 28th, 2023 Alberta Education funding falls into 5 main targeted grants Supports and Base School Community Jurisdiction Instruction Services Specialized Socioeconomic ECS Operations & Learning Support Status Maintenance Grades 1-9 PUF (pre-K) System Geographic High School ESL/Francisation Administration Rural Small Refugee Transportation Nutrition Schools FNM

Note for the last several years the Division also received Bridge and COVID Mitigation Funding

Alberta Education Budget Overview






- Base Instruction Increase of 6% in rates
- Elimination of COVID Mitigation and Bridge Funding
 - Absorbed into Base and Services and Supports

- Services and Supports Increase of 10% in rates
 - New Classroom Complexity Grant (Approximately \$597,000)

Alberta Education Budget Overview



- Operations and Maintenance Increase of 5% in rates
- Transportation New Funding Model for September 1, 2024

- Socioeconomic and Geographic funding used to support instruction
- Nutrition Grant 20% increase


- First year and had 419 survey responses
